II. Community Overview

A. Ride-Around summation

Como is a rural town with a large number of historic homes and churches. Although the town once had more millionaires per capita than any other area in the nation, it is now an eclectic mix of antebellum homes, trailer parks and subsidized housing. There are three modest trailer parks within a one-mile radius of the library. There is an elderly housing facility with an average of 24 residents. There are two apartment style subsidized housing units. There are seven churches within the immediate vicinity of this branch. There is an active Main Street Business district which includes many upscale restaurants and gift shops. Main Street is also home to the library, post office, bank, city hall, police station, fire station, Como Courtyard bed and breakfast, 2 hair stylists, and a paint-your-own pottery shop. There are three large employers in town. They are Tri-County Farm Services, Southern Blind and Shutter Company, and Southern Container. There are three manufactured home distributors in Como at the intersection of Highway 310 and I-55. They are Dick Moore, Freedom Homes, and Fleetwood Homes. Como is home to Lipscomb Brothers Livestock Market with auctions held every Wednesday night. There are four convenience stores, two of which serve hot food, and a package store.

B. History of the library

The town of Como has a long history with its love of books. Long ago some ladies of the town created the Immortelle Club to stimulate interest in cultural pursuits. Around 1920, this club created a reading circle in which each member of the group purchased a recently published book by a noted author. The group rotated the books on a two week schedule until someone fell behind. At that point some shelves were put up in the Como Lumber Co. and the books were placed on the shelves. By 1930 various citizens had contributed books to the collection which was free for all to peruse and borrow from on the "honor system. In the 1940's money was left to the Panola Co. libraries. Mrs. Maybelle Bartlett of Como served as the trustee of the money from Como. Through her interest, a real library became a reality. It was opened on Main Street with Mrs. Aline Wagner as the librarian. Books were donated by the Como Study Club and other interested citizens. The library grew and became part of the First Regional Library System in 1952 with Mrs. Robert Tate as librarian. In 1956 the Town gave the library rent-free space in what is now the old Senior Citizen's Building. In 1964 with Mrs. Fulmer as librarian, Como became independent from Crenshaw and they no longer shared a librarian. The present branch was opened on July 24, 1977 at a total cost of \$96,408.00. It consisted of reading and reference areas, a meeting room to seat sixty, an office, a kitchenette, two restrooms, and four storage areas. In 1994, the Town of Como undertook an expansion of the facilities and in April of 1995 the library re-opened in its current capacity.

C. History of the community

Panola County was established February 9, 1836, and is one of the twelve large northern Mississippi counties created in that year out of the Chickasaw Cession of 1832.

On February 1, 1877, when Quitman County was created, Panola surrendered a small fraction of its southwestern area to assist in forming that county, which reduced Panola from an area of 756 square miles to its present land surface of 705 square miles. It had a population of 27,845, in 1920. Its inhabitants gradually increased in numbers from 1850 to 1910, from 11,444 to 31,274.

Two of the oldest settlements in the county were at Belmont and Panola, a few miles apart, and on opposite sides of the Tallahatchie River. For several years there was a spirited contest between these two towns over the location of the courthouse of Panola County. With the advent of the Mississippi and Tennessee (now the Illinois Central railroad) Belmont was absorbed by Sardis, and Panola was absorbed by Batesville. One result of the above contest is found in the two judicial districts of the county, Sardis being the seat of justice for the first judicial district, and Batesville for the second judicial district into which the county is divided.

Como came up along that same railroad and was established in 1857 upon completion of the rail. The historical marker states Como was name for Lake Como in Italy. Many believe it was name thus because of a large pond built near the first establishment along the rail that was a log store which was used as the post office. Dr. George Tait was one of the first inhabitants in the town of Como along the Mississippi/Tennessee railroad. He donated land for a depot since the government who had taken over the postal service and it came in on the rail. The name Como was transferred for the log store to the depot. For many years the village was known as Como Depot, but at sometime was shortened to Como.

Dr. Tait once owned all the land where the town of Como now stands. Dr. Tait's personal residence, the Masonic Lodge for which he donated the land, and the Railroad Station were the three original buildings constituting the town of Como.

After Dr. Tait's death, his land was sold in lots by his daughter who inherited the property. Thus began the second life of this town. In 1882 the town was incorporated. The first school in town was a private school held in the backyard of a prominent resident. The first public school was held in the lower floor of the remodeled Masonic lodge in the 1870's. After the death of the original teacher in the late

1880's, a real school was established and built on the location of the present Como Elementary School. In 1922, the old school was torn down to make room for the present building.

Como was the site of a prisoner of war camp during World War II. It was purchased from the owners by the War Department in 1942. Many Italian, then German soldiers were housed at the 1300 acre camp just south of Como. After the war ended in 1945, the land was repurchased by the original owners: Phil Pointer of Como, Eugene Howry and John Klyce of Sardis
