II. Community Overview

A. Ride-Around summation

The City of Horn Lake is bound by I-55 to the east, Church Road to the south, DeSoto Road to the north, and Hwy. 301 to the west. In 2004, more than nine square miles (to the west) of mostly residential homes was annexed.

The M. R. Dye Public Library provides service to an urban community of 22,763 (U. S. Census, 2006 population estimates). Horn Lake was incorporated in 1973 and has experienced rapid population growth due to construction booms and annexation. The population increased 70 percent from 1990 to 2000.

U. S. Census data, year 2000, indicate the total population of Horn Lake = 14,099.

General demographic characteristics indicate 49.4 percent of the population was male and 50.6 percent were female. The median age was 28.6 years with only 4.8 percent of the population being 65 years and over. Approximately 35.3 percent of the population was 19 years of age and under. At this time, Horn Lake was a predominantly white community (83.0 percent); black (12.3 percent); Hispanic or Latino (4.3 percent); and other (.4 percent). The average household income was \$50,200, and approximately 70 percent of the city's 5,543 homes were owner occupied.

C. History of the community

In historical times the Chickasaw Indians inhabited the area. Hernando DeSoto and his party, the first Europeans to encounter the Chickasaws wintered with them at the time of his discovery of the Mississippi River. The French Explorer, La Salle, solicited their help on his journey down the Mississippi to the Gulf of Mexico. The area passed through successive Spanish and English rule, finally coming under American governance after the Revolutionary War. In 1832, the Chickasaws relinquished all claims to land east of the Mississippi River by the terms of the Treaty of Pontotoc.

Horn Lake developed from two small settlements: "Little Virginia", and "Forks of the Horn", referring to a local creek. Horn Lake takes its name from an oxbow lake, lying three miles to the west, created when the Mississippi River changed course in the late 18th century leaving a stranded body of water resembling a cow horn. Old maps indicate the date must have been between 1765 and 1796.

Horn Lake's origins began to take shape from the wild frontier land in the early 1830s. By 1846, its agricultural economy was first boosted by the coming of the Memphis to Grenada Railway, now Illinois Central. By 1853, the railroad had established its first stop in Mississippi, at the present intersection of Goodman Road and the Illinois Central railroad track. That same year the first Horn Lake post office was established, and the first depot was built in 1856. Residents began to build stores, cotton gins, a stockyard, black smith shops, and gristmills near the tracks.

The depot received both passengers and freight destined for a horn-shaped lake and recreational area three miles to the west. This area was a popular destination for vacationing Memphians. Daily, the hotel there sent a horse-drawn dray to pick up rail passengers and supplies. Conductors' calls, "All out for Horn Lake" brought two results: a scramble to load the dray, and a permanent name for the railroad station and its surrounding area.

In 1878 a Yellow Fever epidemic nearly wiped the town off the map. By 1900, only 99 residents lived in Horn Lake. By the 1920s, dairy operations and cotton farming helped breathe life back into the town. Surviving the Civil War, two World Wars, and the Great Depression as a rural community, Horn Lake took special pride in Gayoso Farms (1910-1950), a unique operation known for fine hogs and cattle, and its Golden Guernsey milk supplied to Memphis hotels. The first industrial development and the beginning of change came around 1960. In 1963, Dover Elevator built one of the largest elevator plants in the world in Horn Lake. The City of Horn Lake, Mississippi was granted the Charter of Decree of Incorporation, March 3rd, 1973, after three (3) years of planning and work. The original governing body consisted of Winn D. Brown, Sr., as mayor, five (5) aldermen, W.R. Wooten, John Sartain, Anna Calvi, F.G. Thomas, and Winn D. Brown, Jr. Goodman Road became a State highway. Tremendous economic and cultural growth followed, bringing modern streets, shopping centers, libraries,

parks, recreational facilities, schools, and churches to accommodate the population growth. The trains no longer stop, but the Illinois Central Railroad played a great role in Horn Lake's history. A popular barbecue and grocery station, "Bullfrog Corner" is also gone, but the nickname remains due to the frequent flooding and croaking of bullfrogs.

Horn Lake is home to several historical sites:

The most outstanding of these are the following two homes, which exist today. **The Walker Home**: This residence of misses Mattie, Mary and Effie Walker, is located three and one-half miles southeast of Horn Lake on Walker Road. It was originally a four-room log house, one and one-half stories built by Mr. Shannon, a nephew of Mrs. Jewell Walker. She and her family came to this county from Franklin, Tennessee in 1844. Mrs. Jewell Walker, grandmother of the Misses Walker, first lived in a log cabin a few yards from the present house. Logs and bricks used in building the house were hewn and made on the place. Among the historic furnishings of the home is an interesting piano purchased when the first carpetbagger government was overthrown in 1875. On being forced to leave in a hurry, a carpetbagger, living at the site of the Winn D. Brown home, had an auction of his household goods and the mother of the Misses Walker bought the piano. **Octagonal House**: Built in 1844 by Dr. Nathaniel Raines as a gift to his bride, Ann Eldridge, this unusual tree-level, eight-sided house is located on Horn Lake Road just south of Nail Road. Construction of the house was under the direction of William Gwinn. The original house was beautifully finished inside and out. Mr. Bryan Swilly has restored it to the grandeur it deserves.
