II. Community Overview

A. Ride-Around summation

The town of Tunica is the primary town in the County with the county seat located here. Robinsonville, some 15 miles to the north, is increasing in population with apartment, condominiums and single family dwellings being built primarily for the casino employees and retirees. The two grocery stores in the county are located within the city limits of Tunica. Within the five mile radius of the town of Tunica, there are four parks; nine churches; several restaurants; seven gas/quick mart stations; several day care facilities; one public elementary; one middle and one high school; private school K-12; various down-town businesses; two health care clinics. There is no hospital in the county of Tunica. Tunica still has some very run-down housing developments but yet has all types of real estate for housing. Robinsonville, although unincorporated; has its own zip code; the WIN job center; all of the casinos; several gas/quick mart stations; an outlet mall; a public golf course; and an elementary school. The community of Dundee to the south has an elementary school, a post office and no commercial businesses. The community is very much

rural with a primary industry of row crops and catfish. There is an airport serving Tunica with a proposed runway increase to allow more commercial flights landing.

B. History of the library

The Robert C. Irwin Library was formally established in 1968 with the first modern building built in 1974. In 1999 funds from the Tunica County Board of Supervisors and the State of Mississippi appropriated funds to improve and enlarge the present library from 5,358 square feet to 13,320 square feet. With an adequate meeting room in the library which is located clearly in the center of the county government complex, usage is high with all types of events from a voting precinct to health organizations to programs for children. The library is the only facility in the community which provides free public access to the Internet for all.

Over the years, the advisory board have been very active in coordinating events at the library and being a main support for it. The Friends Group has been very active at times and inactive at others.

C. History of the community

Tunica County was established in 1836, located 11 miles south of Memphis and bounded on the west by the Mississippi River. It was named for the tribe of Indians that had a settlement near the southwest corner of the county. The Tunicas were a peaceful, agricultural people. The county claims to be the site of Hernando DeSoto's discovery of the Mississippi River and is dotted with many Indian mounds making it a rich archaeology area. It has had three county seats with Commerce as the first, Austin, the second and Tunica the third in 1885. Until 1992, agriculture was the staple industry in the county. In 1992, the first casino arrived in Tunica County. It now rivals Las Vegas and Atlantic City for the gaming industry and tourism.

Since Tunica County has traditionally been an agricultural community, its population has decreased as has the industry over the past fifty years. However, with the development of the casino industry in the northern part of the county, population trends are turning upward.
